

Ezekiel 2:8-3:11

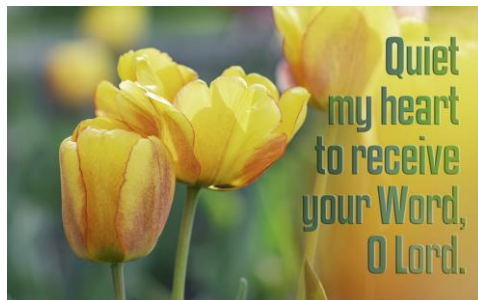

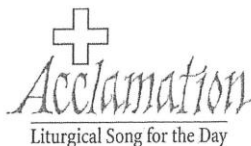

The God Who Desires Mercy

Matt. 9

NICENE CREED


